Appendix C: Best Practices

Best Practice No. 1

Best Practice No. 2

Title: Theme based compositions on Life Skills

Context: The concept of Life Skills was proposed and developed by WHO. These are in all ten life skills like self awareness, creative thinking, critical thinking, problem solving, effective communication, stress management, interpersonal relations, decision making, etc. The life skill education has become the need of the current concern in the curriculum.
